PREPARING YOUR LIFE IN FRANCE

At ESCEM's International Office, we are dedicated to help all international students to prepare their stay in France. We will assist you, along with the student association Aloha, during your daily life in ESCEM. We want you to feel welcome and integrated!

CROUS HOUSING We accompany you during the entire process of application to state-owned residences. This is the cheapest option for student accommodation. You can choose from a range of prices (from 224 euros to 355 euros per month*) depending on the residence you wish to live in. *Prices valid until June 2020

CAF BENEFITS Housing benefits provided by the French state. As a student in France, you can obtain up to half of the amount of your rent depending on the price of your accommodation. We will help you throughout this process. Eligibility for housing benefits is set by CAF administration and depends on the type of visa.

Only students getting « un Visa Long Séjour valant Titre de Séjour (VLS-TS) » will be able to receive Caf housing benefits.

FRENCH OFFICE FOR IMMIGRATION AND INTEGRATION (OFII) We will help you go through the immigration procedure on arrival.

FRENCH HEALTH INSURANCE If you are a non-European student, you can enroll in French Health Insurance for free. You will be refunded 70% of medical expenses in case of sickness.

ALOHA ASSOCIATION We work along with this student association to organize activities for you. Examples of activities we organize: a tour of the city, a boat ride on the Loire river, immersion dinner in a French family, French picnic, farewell party, etc.

BANK ACCOUNT We will help you to arrange a meeting with our partner bank if you wish to open a French bank account (mandatory to get CAF housing benefits).

YOUR LIFE IN TOURS

We host our international students on the Tours campus. Meet our charming, historic, lively and gastronomic city! Tours is located in the heart of the Loire Valley, region classified as a World Heritage site by UNESCO, which is surrounded by beautiful castles and vineyards. "Les Châteaux de la Loire" is the name given to the numerous castles of the region. The city combines the wonders of an authentic French city with today's modern lifestyle. The old neighborhood of the city is full of buildings of traditional architecture with Medieval and Renaissance significance. You can find trendy boutiques, restaurants and bars all located a step away from a very contemporary tramway. Place Plumereau is a pedestrian square encircled by half-timbered houses and paved streets. It is one of the most beautiful squares in France.

Monthly budget to live in Tours (approximate):

- Accommodation (depending on the location and the type of apartment): 224€ – 550€
- City bus and tram pass for students under 26 years old: 23 euros/month
- City bus and tram pass for students from 26 years old: 45 euros/month
- City bus and tram ticket for 1 time (1-hour maximum): 1,4 euros
- Meals (if you cook): between 200 euros and 300 euros
- Dinner out: around 6 euros/person for a kebab restaurant, between 10 and 15 euros/person for a creperie (crêpes restaurant) or a pizza restaurant, from 16 euros/person for a cheese-based dishes restaurant
- Communication (phone plan): From 3 to 30 euros/month

Important: In France, shops and administrations are usually closed on Sundays. Some bakeries and supermarkets are open on Sundays morning. Banks are closed on Sundays and Mondays.

You should bring along with you:

- Passport/ ID card
- Visa that allows you to reside in France during the time of your studies
- Birth certificate translated into French, especially for languages that don't use Latin alphabet. CAF administration (housing benefits) sometimes asks for it.
- ESCEM certificate of enrollment (acceptance letter)
- Some cash in euros for your initial spending on arrival
- A power supply adaptor for French outlets/sockets

Once you are in France, we recommend you to have two copies of your ID documents (passport, visa, etc), to leave one copy at home and to keep one copy with you, just in case you lose them.
